POLICY & ADVOCACY

PRIORITIZING PUBLIC INVESTMENT

AHS manages HousingArlington, a coalition that meets monthly to share information and coordinate policy efforts with a wide spectrum of housing organizations and individual advocates in Arlington. Together we pushed the County Board for continued Affordable Housing Investment Fund allocations in one of the tightest budget years in recent memory. In the end, the allocation to AHIF dropped to \$14.3 million in FY19, providing a preview of several more challenging years ahead.

PRESERVING AFFORDABILITY

AHS serves on the Housing Conservation District advisory group, which was established to protect market-rate affordable housing in 12 areas. In 2018, we supported Arlington County action on issues such as updates to the Real Estate Tax Relief program and easing requirements for updates to two-family dwellings.

PROMOTING COMMITTED AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Our support for Trenton Street Apartments helped Wesley Housing gain approval for the development of an additional 97 units of affordable housing and preservation of the neighboring Whitefield Commons apartments.

ARLINGTON FOR EVERYONE

During the second year of the Arlington For Everyone campaign AHS focused on storytelling to spark dialogue about housing affordability. A total of ten Arlington residents shared their stories through the Arlington For Everyone blog and social media, reaching hundreds of readers with a message that made a case for affordability and inclusion.



LECKEY FORUM

Senator Tim Kaine served as keynote speaker for the 2018 Thomas P. Leckey Forum. In honor of the fiftieth anniversary of the Fair Housing Act, the forum focused on the legacy of housing discrimination and policies that can help us move toward a truly inclusive and diverse community.






