




 - 1920 name change to "Arlington County" from "Alexandria County"






County Growth



+ Definitions

- Covenants
 - Legally enforceable "contract" imposed in a deed upon all future buyers of a property.
- Restrictive Covenants
 - Contractual agreements that prohibit the purchase, lease, or occupation of a piece of property by a particular group of people, usually African Americans.
 - Used by individual sellers, real estate boards, and neighborhood associations
- Suburban
 - Defined by historian Kenneth Jackson via "function (non-farm residential), class (middle and upper status), separation (a daily journey to work), and density (low relative to older sections)."

is now bringing workers to Washington at a rate of 350 a week. The city has not yet come to the point of building barracks for elerks beside the Union Station as it did in War I days, but it may soon.


Washington's growth is not merely a defense phenomenon. Defense has only given an extra fillip to something which has been going on steadily since the first days of the New Deal. In 1933, for instance, Washington had 271 beauty parlors doing a business of 81,300,000 a year. In 1940 it had 600 beauty parlors turning over 83,300,000 a year. When the 1940 ecusus was taken last spring, Washington showed by far the greatest growth of any major U. S. city, having jumped since 1930 from 14th to eleventh largest with an increase of 176,2813 (63,625) to a population of 668,153. Since the census began eleven months ago, an estimated 63,000 people have migrated to live in Washington, and it has almost certainly passed Pittsburgh to become the tenth eity of the land.

Today Washington stands as visible evidence of the peaceful revolution which has been going on in American life since 1933. This social and comonic revolt is, by general agreement, permanent. Even if willike had been elected last year, the Federal Government would unquestionably have gone on being far bigger and playing a far bigger part in U. S. lives than ever before. Today the eitizen who goes to Washington sees the future in action.




A Digital Exploration of Community Building in Arlington County, Virginia


"Built by the People Themselves" explores the processes of community development and suburbanization in Arlington County, Virginia. Arlington is a small county located in northern Virginia, just across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C.


This site is a piece of my doctoral dissertation from George Mason University. Since its earliest suburban development, Arlington was made up of diverse neighborhoods, each with divergent, competing visions for the area's future. My exploration of the process of creating and defending communities within the suburban environment will analyze how the physical environment of Arlington reflected racial tensions, as competitions over race, space, and aesthetics literally built a physical manifestation of a county divided under Jim Crow. This study tracks the roles of the government, community institutions, and planning.
